4. INITIAL RSI COURSE REVIEW (information/discussion)

Get presentation from Emma – Reviewed the purposes of the review and that this was a diagnostic, supportive review.

Reviewed 60 fully online sections with reviewers looking at colleges that were not their own.

Results: 19 of 60 sections would have had requests for additional information (if this had been an actual ACCJC review). District wide was 45% in compliance. CCC was 38% of 13 sections, DVC was 45% of 33 sections, and LMC was 50% of 14 sections.

For courses that we did not see RSI, it was hard to find and took a lot longer to examine. The divide was quite apparent.

Strengths: Tremendous faculty effort in design. BEOI is doing the first step in what we need it to do. High-quality design elements (navigation, modules, and content organization were generally strong). Authentic engagement when present. Clear care for students.

Even where RSI fell short, intent and effort were evident. The design is strong and faculty are trying, but there needs to be more intentional support.

Challenges & Themes: Feedback was minimal or hard to locate. Assessment load vs. instructional presence. Sometimes would see more feedback in the first couple of weeks and then interaction would fade.

How can instructors be supported to develop more consistent and sustainable feedback/interaction?

Many courses had numerous assignments, but little instructor interaction.

Projects and authentic assessments were outstanding when present.

Curation vs. Facilitation (assembly of the course). Many courses relied heavily on publisher slides and other curated videos. Missing was the instructor's voice, relevance, context, "why this matters."

Key Takeaways: Faculty effort is high. Gaps we saw are fixable, learnable, and within our collective capacity to improve. We can strengthen areas that will improve RSI – sustainable feedback practices, rethinking assessment density, supporting instructor presence and facilitation. Opportunity to build shared expectations and support faculty with clear, actionable tools.

Faculty are there and they care, but they need more support.

Need to revise and update BEOI. Develop syllabi templates that explicitly include RSI expectations.

Supports needed: Dedicated time during All-College Day to share findings, strategies, and focused PD around RSI. District support to align with ACCJC expectations around campus-level support structures for high quality DE. DE support/capacity has declined since the pandemic (are at pre-COVID or below levels). What does infrastructure at each of our colleges look like?

Have to move beyond having so many assignments that it's impossible for faculty to provide RSI on them.

	<p>Group discussed at length the results and recommendations. Concern about funding and upscaling current PD pathways (POMP, POCR, RSI in Action).</p> <p>Adrianna asked about bringing back BEHI, Becoming an Effective Hybrid Instructor.</p> <p>Randy asked about district financial support. Kelly noted that there are no funds being stashed away at the district to support this. We can't view this as adding more work for faculty and can think about working smarter vs. harder.</p> <p>Reducing online sections isn't the answer as our online students will simply go elsewhere.</p> <p>Emma noted many other districts set POCR as minimum standards for faculty teaching online.</p> <p>FSCC and guests continued to discuss timelines and options for providing PD.</p>

Kelly Schelin noted that nine of these that are student conduct-related and likely Ac. Senates will want to review. Title IX – (Kelly S. will share visual). In many cases,

policies/procedures that initially included both Title 5 and Title IX details have been broken out into two separate Board Policies. BP 1000 is literally 3 sentences that says who we are and where our sites are. BP 1024 is an update to be in alignment with new remote meeting requirements. BP 1028 – currently we only follow the federal administration’s requirements for flag displays (half-mast) and revisions remove the “only” and the “POTUS” references.

FSCC moved to wave first read on BP 1000 and BP 1024 will take the others to/through Senates. Unanimously approved.
