Workplace Violence Prevention Plan

Cabinet received a report on the status of the Workplace Violence Prevention Plan which is expected to be uploaded to the 4CD website by July 1, 2024, in accordance with recently enacted state legislation. An online training module is in progress to help familiarize employees with the plan and to provide them with additional resources.

State of the District Community Presentations

Cabinet reviewed plans to provide a "State of the District" presentation to various city councils and other civic organizations within 4CD's service area in the coming months.

Facilities Plan Project Review

Cabinet discussed the current Facilities Plan for each of the colleges, priority projects, and corresponding budgets. Additional funding may be forthcoming through a statewide facilities bond measure, which is expected to come before the electorate in the November 2024 general election.
