Governor's May Revise

Cabinet received a report on Governor Newsom's May Revise, which is now before the Legislature for their review and consideration. A final state budget agreement is expected to be signed into law by the end of June, once the Governor and the Legislature have reached an agreement.

Cabinet received an update on current summer enrollment figures, which are trending upwards with additional in-person and hybrid classes being offered across all three campuses to better meet the needs of students.

Utility Cost Reduction Strategies
