Accounting and Finance Services Department Review

Cabinet received a presentation from Associate Vice Chancellor/Chief Financial Officer Dr. Tony Wold, who shared an overview of the services his department provides to t4CD and the staff responsible for the accounting and finance services.

Enrollment Up Districtwide

Cabinet received an update about District enrollment trends. Overall, total enrollment Districtwide is up 10.9% year over year for the spring semester, and up 6.5% for full-time equivalent students (FTES).

Target X Update

Cabinet received an overview of the customer relationship management (CRM) platform Target X by Executive Vice Chancellor, Education and Technology Kelly Schelin, who shared information about how each college is using the tool to reach current and prospective students.

Request for Help from Jewish Family Children's Services (JFCS)

JFCS provides services to refugees and has experienced major funding cuts by the federal government. The organization needs assistance with training, language services, development of resumes and jobs. They would also like to have volunteers work with refugees on translation services, listening and other items. Cabinet members are exploring ways to assist this nonprofit.
