4CD Colleges as Minority Serving Institutions

Cabinet heard a presentation regarding 4CD's DEIB Training, which included a Glossary of Terms. Assessing policies and procedures through a DEIB lens was also discussed, with the suggestion made to implement this practice within the curriculum review process. A Districtwide subgroup of DEIB will be created so the colleges can focus on specific goals.

Climate Survey

Since it has not been done for several years, Cabinet discussed the possibility of conducting a future climate survey, taking into consideration historical trends and other information. This topic will be brought to a future District Governance Council meeting for discussion.

Regroup – Emergency Notifications and Testing

An overview of Regroup and recent updates to this system were discussed by Cabinet. Future presentations on the system will be held for Safety Committees Districtwide.

Centralization of International Education Admissions

Cabinet heard a presentation on the centralization of the international admissions process. Like international student recruitment, beginning in January 2025, international admissions will be centralized at the District Office. With the addition of the admissions process, the 4CD International Education team will be responsible for all international student recruitment, application processing, document collection, and I-20 issuance. Once admitted, students will be assisted by the college international student offices for orientation and ongoing student support.
