The mission of the Chancellor's Cabinet is to serve as the leadership team ensuring the capacity of 4CD to educate students effectively and meet the needs of its communities in partnership with classified professionals, faculty, and other managers.

Standardized Attendance Accounting and Enrollment Management

Cabinet discussed the Standardized Attendance Accounting Method (Credit), which will eliminate Weekly Census, Daily Census, and Alternative Attendance Accounting Methods. Taking into consideration technology, fiscal impact, schedule development and training, the new accounting methodology could be utilized by 4CD now through 2026-27.

Review of Business Procedures

Revisions regarding alcoholic beverages and payment of special services contractors were discussed. Revisions to Business Procedure 18.04, Academic and Classified Senate Budget Guidelines were also discussed, and will be presented at the November District Governance Council meeting for review and approval.

November Elections

Voting by employees during the upcoming elections was discussed. Cabinet reached consensus on issuing a broader message to the 4CD community to reaffirm its commitment to the 4CD mission and to share information regarding voting guidance.
