


4CD Celebrates Pride Month

Each June, 4CD celebrates Pride Month, which honors the 1969 Stonewall riots in New York City, that served as a catalyst for the LGBTQIA+ rights movement. The month-long celebration recognizes the influence that LGBTQIA+ individuals have had on history, culture, and society, and acknowledges the ongoing struggles for equal rights and acceptance.


All 4CD colleges began their Pride Month festivities by hosting flag raising ceremonies at each campus. These events allowed community members to connect, celebrate, and honor Pride Month's rich history and diversity. LMC President **Pamela Ralston** and Diablo Valley College (DVC) President **Susan Lamb** delivered speeches to commemorate the celebration of the Pride flag raising ceremonies, and students along with 4CD community members joined in on the occasion to deliver speeches of their own.

In addition to the flag raising ceremonies, DVC celebrated the first year of its Community of Pride cohort, where students took courses themed around issues of importance in the LGBTQIA+ community. LMC hosted a fun Pride Month karaoke party, while Contra Costa College (CCC) celebrated by continuing its chalk drawing tradition from last year.

The 4CD Governing Board passed a resolution recognizing June 2024 as Pride Month, which stated, in part, "4CD is proud to recognize June 2024 as LGBTQIA+ Pride Month and will continue to promote an atmosphere of respect for all students and employees and denounce and address hate speech directed at students and/or employees, including immigrants, people of color, practitioners of faith, individuals with disabilities, LGBTQIA+ individuals, persons identifying with minority genders and sexualities, and members of other protected groups." Juneteenth Celebrations

On June 17, 2021, Juneteenth became a federal holiday, commemorating the emancipation of enslaved African Americans. Although recently recognized, Juneteenth is the oldest national celebration of the end of slavery, observed since the late 1800s. Celebrating freedom and serving as a reminder of the ongoing fight against racism, June 19th marks Juneteenth, the day in 1865 when Union soldiers led by Major General Gordon Granger announced the end of slavery in Galveston, Texas. Traditionally, Juneteenth includes activities focused on education, self-improvement, and community, as well as guest speakers, elder stories, and prayer services.

Joining in the community engagement, CCC joined in the City of Richmond's Juneteenth celebrations at Nichols Park. LMC tabled at the City of Oakley's Juneteenth Celebration at Civic Plaza on June 15th. Both colleges highlighted the college's resources and programs.
