4CD Visits Legislative Representatives in Sacramento

CCC and LMC Earn Black-Serving Institution Designation

Contra Costa and Los Medanos colleges have each earned state designation as a Black-Serving Institution (BSI) under California's new Black-Serving Institutions Program Act (SB 1348), a recognition that underscores the colleges' longstanding commitment to advancing Black student success, equity, and belonging within higher education.

The BSI designation recognizes colleges and universities that demonstrate a strong commitment to serving Black and African American students through robust academic resources, culturally responsive programs, and clear pathways to higher education and career opportunities. To qualify, institutions must have either at least 10% of students identify as Black or African American or enroll a minimum of 1,500 students from these communities.

The colleges' initiatives include mentorship programs, culturally responsive curriculum, student leadership development, and community partnerships that champion Black excellence and achievement.
